Your union not only includes workers in bakeries, candy, cereal, sugar, grain mills, tobacco plants, food processing and manufacturing facilities but many other occupations related to these industries as well. The BCTGM is an organization of, by and for working people. You and your union brothers and sisters have the right to elect local leaders and participate in making decisions that will affect you.
